Reading for Pleasure

Reading is very important for our children. This is not just learning to read. Studies show that reading for pleasure makes a big difference to children's educational performance.

Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment every day not only perform better in reading tests than those who don't, but also develop a broader vocabulary, increased general knowledge and a better understanding of other cultures.

In fact, reading for pleasure is more likely to determine whether a child does well at school than their social or economic background.


This week we will be launching our Reading Passport. Children will be given a Reading Passport that will have 10 books relevant to their year group. These books have been chosen by pupils in our school. Across the school year, children can put the date under the book they have read and if they manage to read all 10 by the end of the year, they will receive a prize.

The paper copies of the Reading Passport will stay in school but we will post them on Dojo and the school website.


Regular Reader Awards




