Guide to Remote and Blended Learning During Lockdown

19th October 2020

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to outline how we will support children who are not at school, using either 'blended' or 'remote' learning as detailed below:

'Blended Learning' will be used if your child has to self-isolate due COVID-19 infection within your family. Your child's teacher will continue to work with children in school as well as supporting your child's learning at home.

'Remote Learning' will be used if school is closed due to a local or national lockdown or due to a confirmed case of COVID-19 amongst staff or children. Teachers will then be leading the learning from home.

When children are ill we are not expecting them to work at home and will do our best to plug any gaps in their learning when they return. Our Remote Learning Policy is available on our school website: <u>www.longney.gloucs.sch.uk.</u>

If children are learning remotely, we hope this will only be for a short while, perhaps two weeks, and we will continue with new learning when they return to school. We would not want to teach again what has been set remotely during this time, and would therefore want all our children to access the daily learning set by their teacher. Do contact teachers or me if you need support to enable this to happen.

We do recognise that it is not always possible, or appropriate, to sit with your child to complete activities, and teachers will aim to ensure that learning is accessible to all. Please do contact your class teacher if your child is struggling and needs support. Having used the Purple Mash and Class Dojo before and during lockdown, we are keen to continue with these are our primary sites. We are looking to introduce Atom Learning for Key Stage 2 and Rising Stars Reading Planet for pupils to access online books.
