Reading:

As you are all aware, reading is a key component to the children's learning. It helps them to broaden their vocabulary, their understanding of the wider world and helps them to become independent in their work as well as many other benefits.

The children should be reading every day. This does not have to be a whole book but consistency is key to developing reading ability. The children will be given books from school but they can of course read other literature from home. A log of their reading should be kept in their yellow reading record even if it was a book from home.

Maths:

Maths is also key to the children's curriculum. However, sending sheets of maths work home doesn't always help their understanding. Instead, in Skylark class, we are going to adopt the interactive style of learning for our maths homework.

Every Friday, I will post some links to various online games linked to what we have been learning in maths that week. If the children could go onto these games as often as they can, it will really help their maths develop in a fun and interactive way. These links will be posted on Dojo and may be different for the year 1 and year 2 children.

P4C:

As a school we use the P4C approach (Philosophy for Children). This approach enables us a school to develop critical, creative, collaborative and caring thinking across our whole school. We believe family and home discussions are great for this. Therefore, twice a half term I will post a big question on our dojo for you to talk about at home. This will aid our class discussion in the lesson following.

If your child would like to do any extras for our learning, they can. This may include;

- A project based on our topic.
- Research based on our topic.
- Topic related art at home.
