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Dear Parents of Year 6,

Thank you for your support over the recent few months in what has been a difficult and challenging time for all our pupils and families. I am very aware that this has been even more so for our Year 6 who are coming to the end of their time with us here at Longney.

It is lovely to have Year 6 back in with us at the present time, it has been good to see them interacting with each other and the staff. The opportunity to touch base with school after such a long time is very important for everyone. All pupils need to have this opportunity before the summer holiday but in order to offer this to our other year groups, we have decided that we will say goodbye to our Year 6 pupils on Thursday 2nd July. This has not been an easy decision but secondary school transitions are due to take place at the beginning of July and this gives us the opportunity to reorganise our groups at this point.
