Happy New Year!

Welcome back to the new term, I hope you had an enjoyable Christmas holiday. The term ahead is shorter than last term but just as busy so please keep an eye on the newsletter for information and dates. Please can I just send a reminder about the car park and driving safely. There were some near misses last term and I would ask everyone to drive slowly through the car park and the lanes and also to supervise your children closely when walking through the car park. Please park with consideration to our neighbours in the village. The lane next to the school should not be used for parking as it is a private access road. Also, some drivers have been spotted locally by an off duty policeman using their mobile whilst driving. As you are aware, this is illegal as it is very dangerous and you may be given a fine if caught.

Absence from School

Gloucestershire Local Authority have issued new documentation associated with the Penalty Notice protocol for absence from school. For your information, the letters are attached with this newsletter along with the Attendance Advice leaflet for parents. We aim for 100% attendance of every pupil excepting illness, non-routine appointments and exceptional circumstances in line with national guidelines. Please remember that if your child is persistently late for school, this counts as an unauthorised absence for the whole morning session. These sessions could then count toward the total unauthorised absence and, therefore, a penalty notice.

Reading

Reading is one of the most important skills and underpins everything we do at school. A growing number of studies have evidenced that Reading for Pleasure has an impact on:

- Reading attainment and writing ability;
- Text comprehension and grammar;
- Breadth of vocabulary;
- Positive reading attitudes;
- Greater self-confidence as a reader;
- Pleasure in reading in later life;
- General knowledge;
- A better understanding of other cultures;
- Community participation;
- A greater insight into human nature and decision-making and
- Higher attainment across the curriculum.

It is very important, therefore, that children are heard to read regularly at home, ideally every night, and also that there is an opportunity for sharing books or being read to. The latter give children access to books at a higher vocabulary level than they may be able to access independently, thus building their word and sentence knowledge. Also, children find it difficult to be proficient writers if they do not read widely enough, therefore, we will be focusing on reading for pleasure with pupils this term.
