Understanding the world

Enjoys joining in with family customs and routines

- Shows interests in the lives of people who are familiar to them.
- Remembers and talks about significant events in their own experience
- Recognises and describes special times or events for family or friends
- Shows interests in different occupations and ways of life
- Comments and ask questions about aspects of their familiar world such as the place where they live or the natural world
- Can talk about some of the things they have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects

Mathematics

- Recognise some numerals of personal significance
- Recognises numerals 1 to 5
- Counts up the three or four objects by saying one number name for each item
- Counts actions or objects which cannot be moved
- Counts objects to 10, and beginning to count beyond 10
- Recites number in order to 10
- Shows an interest in numerals in the enviornment
- Shows an interest in representing numbers.
- Beginning to use mathematical names for 'solid' 3D shapes and 'flat' 2D shapes, and mathematical terms to describe shapes.

PSED

- Explains own knowledge and understanding, and asks appropriate questions of others
- Confident to speak to other about own needs, wants, interest and opinions
- Can play in a group, extending and elaborating play ideas, e.g. building up a role-play activity with other children.
- Demonstrates friendly behaviour, initiating conversations and forming good relationships with peers and familiar adults.

Physical development

- Negotiates space successfully when playing racing and chasing games with other children, adjusting speed or changing direction to avoid obstacles.
- Shows preference for a dominant hand.
- Uses simple tools to effect changes to materials.
- Handles tools, objects, construction and malleable materials safely and with increasing control.

Computing

- Recognise common uses of information technology beyond the school
- Use technology purposefully to create, organise, store, manipulate and retrieve digital content.

Literacy

- · Continues a rhyming string.
- Hears and says the initial sound in words.
- Can segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together and knows which letters represent some of them.
- Links sounds to letters, naming and sounding the letters of the alphabet.
- Begins to read words and simple sentences.
- Uses vocabulary and forms of speech that are increasingly influenced by their experiences of books.
- Enjoys an increasing range of books.
- Knows that information can be retrieved from books and computers.

Communication and language

- Maintains attention, concentrates and sit quietly during appropriate activity.
- Two-channelled attention- can listen and do for short span.
- Extends vocabulary, especially by grouping and naming, exploring the meaning and sounds of new words.
- Uses language to imagine and recreate roles and experiences in play situations

Expressive arts and design

- Sings a few familiar songs
- Initiates movement in response to music
- Experiments mixing colours.
- Uses different materials to create texture.
- Builds stories around toys
- Chooses particular colours to use for a purpose.

Characteristics of effective learning

- Finding ways to solve problems
- Testing their ideas
- Have their own ideas
- Uses senses to explore the world around them.
- Showing curiosity about objects, events and people.
- Maintain focus on their activity for a period of time.
- Initiating activities.
- Showing satisfaction in meeting their own goals.
- Being proud of how they accomplished something- not just the end result.
- Enjoying meeting challenges for their own sake rather than external rewards and praise.
