Dear Parents,
As you will know from our class newsletter, we have been in consultation regarding our homework expectations. We now have this clarified and can outline this for you in this letter.

As you are probably aware, homework is an important part of schoolwork and helps pupils to consolidate and reinforce the skills and understanding that they have learnt in school. It also develops self-discipline and independence. We are mindful that your children are nearing the end of primary school and so in preparation for secondary school expectations, as a staff team, we have agreed the following homework schedule:

| Reading <br> 20 minutes per day | Minimum of five times a week - everyday if possible! <br> A small comment should be added into their homework diaries every time they read to someone. <br> Please note: if your child has been unable to read at home, they will spend part of their breaktime the next day reading to an adult. |  |  |
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| Times tables 10-20 minutes per day | Every week in class, we will focus on a times table - it would be very beneficial for your child to practise this times tables at home. This could be whilst they are having breakfast, walking up the stairs, driving in the car anywhere and anytime! The ability to rehearse and recall multiplications up to and including 12 will enable your child to tackle more complex mathematical subjects confidently and skilfully as they progress in their education. Please see the dates below for the times tables focus until the October half term: |  |  |

| Maths <br> 30 minutes per week | Maths homework will be given out on a Friday, to be handed in the following Tuesday. Maths homework will always reflect their learning in school and they should be able to complete it independently. <br> Please note: if homework is not handed in by Tuesday, children will be expected to spend a break/lunch time to complete it. |  |  |

Children should not be expected to spend significantly longer on homework than the guide times above, however occasionally some homework activities may take more or less time than suggested.
