Defibrillator in School

All schools now are provided with a defibrillator and I'm pleased to say that ours is set up in the lobby. It is unlikely we will need to use this but it is there just incase. There is a very helpful video which shows adults how to use the defibrillator if needed which has been shared with all staff. I thought I would share it <u>here</u> so that you can watch it if you feel it would be useful for you in your life outside of school.

Guitar Lessons – Gloucestershire Music

This term, Swifts class have started their 10 weeks of whole class music tuition with a Gloucestershire Music teacher – Mr Sykes. All the children have an instrument so that they can learn together how to read music and how to perform confidently, an important part of the national curriculum for music.







Positive Behaviour Rewards

This term we have introduced a new positive element to our behaviour management system in Skylarks, Goldfinch and Swifts. The children earn dojo points within class and these are added together so that the reward is earnt by the whole class. We thought carefully about how we could introduce a positive behaviour scheme which would ensure the children were working together in harmony and not in competition with each other. Because of this, everyone is happy and excited when anyone in the class achieves and they all support each other to make good choices and go above and beyond in school.

When the children get to 250 dojo points as a class, they receive a book for the classroom from a list they put together at the start of the year, this means that their reward is linked to learning and the joy of reading. After they achieve 500 dojo points as a class they have a tea party together with myself and the teachers, bringing **joy** and **harmony**. I'm pleased to say that Skylarks, Goldfinch and Swifts have all earnt their tea parties within the last two weeks and we had lots of fun in the hall together – everyone particularly enjoyed musical statues as you can see! Swallows class will be introduced to Dojo points later in the year to prepare them for their transition to year 1.











Stay Safe Workshops

Last week, the children were visited by Stay Safe Workshops. From Swallows to Swifts, the children took part in sessions with Richard who taught them all about how to stay safe online. This is an important part of the national curriculum and very relevant to the children. I have attached a parents' leaflet to the this School Ping from Stay Safe Worskshops which has tips for how to keep your child safe online at home.



Chromebooks

I'm pleased to share that at the end of last year we were able to purchase 15 more Chromebooks for school to add to the set which were purchased by the Friends of Longney. This means that we now have enough for every child to have their own Chromebook during our computing lessons. This means they don't have to share and can get so much more out of these lessons as a result.

Sports Coaches

We are working this year with a range of sports coaches to enhance the children's learning in PE. This gives them chance to try out new sports and activities alongside the national curriculum taught by the teacher.

This term year 2,3 and 4 worked with the skateboarding and scootering coaches who were absolutely fantastic and it was a joy to see them out in the sunshine each week. On a Wednesday, the children in swifts class have been working with an archery coach out on the field to learn the basics of the sport. Next term, year 2, 3 and 4 will be having a martial arts session each week with a qualified coach – we hope this will be a really fantastic opportunity for them all to try a new skill and increase their confidence and **belief** in what they can achieve.
